One of the hardest things I had to do was change my "engineering" mentality of building things correctly up front. There's no point taking a month to perform a task perfectly if your company only lasts 3 weeks. Founders have to solve the problem at hand with the simplest solution that works without sacrificing the long term viability of the company, then iterate.
